# A Home For Austin

Austin is a 26 year old developmentally disabled young man who lived with his parents, both of whom are alcoholics and drug addicts. To sustain their addictions, Austin's parents took him to the seedier parts of Denver and sell him to those seeking illicit sexual favors. In the early morning hours, Austin could then be found wandering aimlessly on the streets of downtown Denver waiting for his parents to find him and take him home.



Pastor Michael is a minister in Denver who often drives these same streets looking to help those who might be in need. Early one morning while driving around, Pastor Michael found Austin walking by himself and stopped to ask him if he needed anything. Austin said he was hungry. Pastor Michael took him to a restaurant to feed him, and during their conversation, Austin shared the horrific story of his life. In addition to feeding Austin, Pastor Michael also took him into his home while he sought to find a more suitable and permanent home for Austin. What he discovered in his ensuing research with local, state and federal officials, was there was not a single place that would take Austin. As he expanded his research to the internet, Pastor Michael, who still cares for Austin, happened on the website for Farm in the Dell International, and reached out to the foundation. Unfortunately, this is the same story we hear almost daily about such a tremendous need and virtually no resources to help. Unfortunately, there are no current openings for Austin or any other deserving person with special needs, at the time. For Austin, it's even more disappointing, because he wants nothing more than to be a Cowboy and dreams of a life on a farm or ranch. That's where you come into the picture.
